



Conference Scope

The International Nanotechnology Conference on Communication and Cooperation aims at bringing together senior researchers, industry leaders and policy makers for in-depth discussions and technical sessions on a variety of issues related to the future of international collaboration in nanotechnologies. In order to strengthen the continuous dialogue between Europe, Japan and the United States, broad regional overviews will be combined with detailed presentations from each of the regions and technical sessions highlighting today's state of affairs and tomorrow's challenges. The technical scope of the conference covers all aspects of nanoelectronics and explores links with related areas, such as biotechnology, advanced materials development, Microsystems and photonics. A topical session will highlight the economical and societal implications of nanotechnology.

Poster submission

If you would like to submit an abstract for the poster session, please send your full name and complete contact information, along with your abstract to posters@inc-conf.net. Posters should be of high quality and general interest. Key topics may include:

1. Technical presentations of key research results and novel work of high regional significance. The technical description should appeal to a wide audience and may contain a significant tutorial content.
2. Regional programmatic descriptions describing organized research efforts or regionally identified research needs
3. Description of key regional research facilities, especially those with unique capabilities.

Abstracts should be 200 words or less and are due February 9, 2007. Abstracts will undergo a peer review selection and all submitters will be notified of the selection results by March 2, 2007. Selection criteria include technical quality and broad interest. Abstracts of the posters that have been selected for the poster session will be distributed at the conference. The posters will be posted on the conference website. Details on how the poster must be prepared will be mailed to the authors in due time. Poster presenters are expected to be present for interaction with the conference attendees during the poster viewing reception on April 17, from 6:45pm until 8:30pm. Posters can remain on display during the remainder of the conference. For each accepted poster, one author will be allowed registration at a reduced fee of 200 EUR (before March 30).
